KCC Daily Devotion

Monday: In December of 1758, Benjamin Franklin printed in the London Chronicle the first known citation in the United States of the phrase "Old habits die hard". 263 years later we find this to still be one of the most literal meaning phrases of all time. Habits are hard to break! Habits become more and more ingrained into a person over time (both good and bad habits). Imagine how much easier life and church would be if once baptized, we IMMEDIATELY never have to worry with old habits or ways are morally flawless and spiritually wise. But that ain't how it works. This week, let's spend time together learning how to break old habits. Lord, help us. In Jesus, amen.

Tuesday: Yogi Berra is credited with saying, "It's deja vu all over again!" He must have read this weeks portion of our "Trek of Faith" from the life of Abraham in Genesis 20. Back in Genesis 12, Abram lied to Pharaoh saying Sarai was his sister. Here in Genesis 20:2 we see him AGAIN telling a different leader that Sarah is his sister. 25 years have past and she is STILL the cats meow. Old habits are hard to break. Father, help us overcome our past. Help us grow in our faith as we strive to live in Your way. In Jesus name, amen.

Wednesday: "But God". These are two of the sweetest words found in scripture. The waters flooded the earth for 150 days...but God remembered Noah(Gen. 8:1). Josephs brothers intended to harm him greatly...but God had other plans(Gen. 50:20). "We are harassed at every turn, conflicts on the outside, fears within"...But God comforts us(2 For. 7:5-6). "We are dead in our transgressions"...but God who is rich in mercy made us alive in Christ(Eph. 2:1-5)." Abraham causes a mess of things...but God came through, again. O, God, thank You. Thank You for correcting our ignorance and mistakes. Thank You for overcoming our selfish and sin filled ways. In Jesus name, amen.

Thursday: Check out this weeks portion in Genesis 20 if you have yet to do so. In verses 8-13 we see Abimelech and Abraham have a heart to heart. Abimelech had every right to be FURIOUS and offended. He hadn't done anything wrong and yet Abraham almost has him killed. Abrahams explanation is pathetic, but at least it's honest. You see, a partial truth is still a whole lie. Deception is lying. While one might feel they are helping, the reality still remains that this is wrong. Lord, create in me a clean heart as the Psalmist requests as well. Help me get out of Your way. In Jesus name, amen.

Friday: If you read yesterdays section again, does it appear that Abraham is pretty much saying, "I follow the one true God, but I don't trust Him enough to protect me, so I lie to protect myself." Finish reading the rest of this portion from verses 14-18. Could Abimelech be so forgiving and gracious simply because he knows God is covering Abraham? How about your life? Would you proceed with confidence from now on knowing if you are in God, He has you covered? Father, forgive me. Forgive my lack of faith. Forgive my rushing the process. Forgive my not trusting and waiting in You. I desire to be a servant who loves all and reaches the lost. Use me as You see fit. In Jesus, amen.

Saturday: Tomorrow we will wrap up this lesson in our "Trek of Faith" by borrowing 3 "Nevers" from Charles Swindoll. Never presume on your own weaknesses, never rely on your own crutches, and never lean on your own understanding. The old hymn, Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing, sings: "Prone to wander, Lord, I feel it. Prone to leave the God I love." Old habits are hard to break, aren't they? The great news is how we celebrate God sending us Jesus to heal our past. God, thank You for Your love. In Jesus name, amen.
