Morning Message: Real Livin' (Being Spirit Lead)

KCC Daily Devotion

Monday: What if I were to tell you, there is a race of aliens living on earth, in plain view. There is a species of people called the pneumatikoi who don't actually belong in this world. They look just like ordinary human beings physically, but in reality these aliens are tuned into the frequency of a powerful being from another dimension. A startling fact is: The goal of these aliens is to multiply their number. When an outsider joins the pneumatikoi, he or she is infected with the same unseen life-force as well. Once joined, a metamorphosis begins, transforming them into a new kind of creature in the image of their leader. Who are they? Stay tuned...God, help us! In You and You alone can we be transformed. Make us wholly Yours. In Jesus name, amen.

Tuesday: While yesterday sounded like some sci-fi deal, it's not! This alien group, the pneumatikoi, or "Spirit people" are who Paul describes in Romans 8. As Jesus tells us in John 3:3 and 5, we must be born again of water AND The Spirit. We are to be aliens! Even one of the closest to Jesus calls us this in 1 Peter 2:11 where Peter describes follower of Christ as being "aliens and strangers in the world". Spend time today praying for THE Church. Pray we can draw in and reach One more person as we strive to bring all the freeing & loving grace of Jesus Christ. Lord, here I am. Use me. In Jesus, amen.

Wednesday: Romans 8:14 tells us, "For all those led by Gods Spirit are Gods sons." The word "For" that begins this verse ties in everything we looked at Sunday with everything we need to continue learning about. The reason we can live...TRULY live...is because we are led by the Spirit of God. The term "son" here is not referring to males only, but is emphasizing a child who has come of age, a mature, adult child who enjoys all the rights and privileges of his position. As we have seen before in regards to salvation, there is neither male nor female (Galatians 3:26-28). Father, thank You for the freedom You offer each and every one of us. I pray we take full advantage of this by surrendering our all to Your way. Help us surrender our all. In Jesus, amen.

Thursday: There's an old, old question that goes: "If you were arrested for being a Christian, would there be enough evidence to convict you?" It's a good question! Is there? Do we love His Word? Are we drawn to talk with Him in prayer? Do we love His people and do we spend time with them in worship? Do we enjoy telling others about Him? Do we spend more time in His ways/things or with our own trips, moneys, plans, stuff? If you met you, would you know in whom you believe? O, God, this is a humbling question! Forgive me when I mess stuff up. Help me gain focus on how I should live. In Jesus name, amen.

Friday: "For you did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear. Instead, you received the Spirit of adoption, by whom we cry out, 'Abba, Father!'(Romans 8:15)". Through Christ we have freedom (no spirit of slavery). Through Christ we have no fear (no spirit of slavery to fall back into fear). Through Christ we gain favor (Instead, you received the Spirit of adoption). Through Christ we gain familiarity (by whom we cry out, "Abba, Father!"). While ABBA is a Swedish rock group from back in the 70's and 80's, here it is a term of endearment. It's like a child crawling into their fathers lap and saying "I love you, Daddy". Lord, thank You for all we gain in Christ. In Him, amen.

Saturday: While we have picked this weeks verses apart up to now, grab a Bible and read this weeks section of Romans 8:14-17. Verses 16 & 17 let us know that we can face suffering. If, indeed, we suffer with Him, we will also be glorified together with Him. An old Hymn says it best: "Heaven Will Surely be Worth it All". Father, this world truly ain't our home. We are just aliens passing through. Guide us until Heaven comes or we meet You there. In Jesus, amen.
